

INFECTION CONTROL GUIDELINES FOR HOSPITAL TOURS AND CAMPUS VISITORS

Finding cures. Saving children.

To protect patients' health and safety, visitors who would like to tour the hospital are asked to follow these guidelines:

- All ages may visit the Danny Thomas/ALSAC Pavilion if open. It is located on the hospital campus. All children younger than 16 must be accompanied by an adult.
- Visitors must be 16 years of age or older to visit the hospital.
- Many patients are not able to fight off infection well because of their diseases and treatments. You must plan to visit at a later date if you or a member of your household:
 - Are sick or have been exposed to an illness that spreads easily from one person to another;
 - Have had a temperature of 100.4 degrees or greater in the last 48 hours;
 - Have vomiting or diarrhea;
 - Have "pink eye";
 - Have a rash that might be chickenpox, shingles, measles, or another illness that spreads easily;
 - Have a cold, flu, or respiratory infection (runny nose, congestion, sore throat, or cough);
 - Have had a fever with cough, runny nose, and pink eyes followed by a rash during the last 3 weeks;
 - Have had contact with someone who might have measles within the last 3 weeks;
 - Have a draining wound;
 - Have a rash after recently receiving the chickenpox vaccine; or
 - Received the oral polio or smallpox vaccine within the past 4 weeks.

We want you to have a memorable experience while also protecting the safety and well-being of our patients. Please follow these guidelines:

- Visitors must be accompanied by an ALSAC or St. Jude staff member with an ID badge at all times.
- For privacy purposes, no photos or videos are allowed of patients, families, or staff.
- Visitors should avoid interacting with patients or their families to safeguard health and privacy.
- St. Jude is a tobacco-free campus. Smoking and the use of tobacco, including electronic cigarettes, is prohibited on campus.
- Campus shuttle buses are for patients, families, and staff only.
